

The Divine Mercy

Helena Kowalska was born in Lagiewniki, Poland in 1905. She was one of many children of poor, farming parents. She had the equivalent of a 3rd grade education. Yet, there was something strangely unusual about her. From a very young age she was

prayerful, spiritual and humble. She grew up to be a Nanny. She loved to dance, especially the Polka. It was at one of these dances that the Lord Jesus called her to a spiritual mission of spreading His Mercy. Although she didn't know it at the time, because when God calls each of us, He reveals Himself in small increments.

Rejected from several convents, she finally was admitted to the Sisters of Mercy in Warsaw, Poland. These Sisters of Mercy are not to be confused with the Sisters of Mercy founded in Ireland by Mother McCaughley. Incidentally, Mother McCaughley's Sisters from Ireland were the very first female Order to serve the Catholics of the State of Connecticut.

When she was fully professed as a nun she was given the name; Faustina. Immediately, Jesus began to appear to her informing her of His Mercy. He dictated a book to her amounting to 600 pages called "<u>Divine Mercy In My Soul.</u>"

She is known as the "Apostle of Mercy", as Jesus gave her the Mission of spreading His Mercy to all people. Unfortunately, her message was suppressed from 1958-1978. A certain priest/bishop by the name of Karol Wojtyla worked diligently to have her message made known again. The banns were lifted in April of 1978. Six months later, he became Pope Paul II, honored today as Saint John Paul II.

To St. Faustina, Jesus left the Divine Mercy Chaplet, a short series of beautiful prayers, said on rosary beads. Jesus instructed her that reciting the Divine Mercy Chaplet is the surest way to gain Mercy for sinners, the dying, those with illnesses and God's Peace of mind and heart.

On April 30, 2000, Faustina Kowalska was declared a Saint by John Paul II in St. Peter's Square, at Vatican City. She was the very first person declared a saint at the beginning of the millennium.

I emphatically add that this is not a "Polish Devotion". It is a devotion for the universal Catholic Church. It happens that St. Faustina and St. John Paul II are from Poland. Just as the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is not a "French Devotion". Yes, St. Margaret Mary Alocoque was French and the apparition occurred in the Convent of Paray Le Monial in France., but it doesn't make the devotion French. It, too, is for the Universal Church.
