

#### Missionaries of Our Lady of La Salette

Each year the Archdiocese of Hartford assigns each parish a summer missionary. This year, the La Salette Fathers have been assigned to St. Aloysius Church. They will preach the mission on the weekend of August 3-4, 2019. St. Aloysius Church warmly welcomes Most Rev. Rene Butler, M.S. to our parish. Most Rev. Butler is the Provincial Superior of the Missionaries of the La Salette. Since he carries the title of Provincial Superior, technically he is a Bishop within the Order of the La Salettes. All religious Orders have Superiors, bishops. It is the reason why he carries the title "Most Reverend". He is to be addressed as "Father".

Having brought the fullness of Life to our world when He rose from the dead, Jesus sent his disciples to share this life with all of creation. "They went forth and preached everywhere" (Mk 16:20). The Missionaries of Our Lady of La Salette minister to people of every race, language, culture and way of life – beginning at the La Salette Shrine in France where our Blessed Mother appeared in 1846. Her final words, "Well, my children, you will make this known to all my people," echo Jesus' Gospel mandate. It is little wonder that the La Salette Congregation has always been mission orientated. When called upon by the Vatican to preach the Gospel in foreign lands, they eagerly responded. This spirit brought them to missions in 27 countries, especially among the poor in Angola, Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Haiti, India, Madagascar, Myanmar and the Philippines. With your cooperation, the Missionaries of La Salette can continue to provide spiritual and financial assistance to these mission countries as they bring God's reconciling message to the poor.

## The La Salette Missions help in the following areas:

Assisting the addicted and mentally challenged in Madagascar, the Philippines and India.

Providing vocational programs to help single and unemployed women in Bolivia and Argentina

## History of The Apparition of LaSalette LaSalette, France 1846

The Apparitions of Our Blessed *Lady of LaSalette* occurred in the mountain slopes of Sous-Les-Baisses on September 19, 1846. Two shepherd children, Maximin, Giraud, a twelve year old boy who was skittish and very carefree and a fifteen year old girl, Melanie Calvat who was timid and withdrawn saw, as they would come to describe it; "a beautiful Lady". Then again, twelve years (1858) later in Lourdes, France (the same country) Bernadette would see a vision in the cave of Marsabielle and call that vision "a beautiful Lady", too.

The children of LaSalette, Maximin and Melanie would say that the Lady's beauty was far beyond any description of any language.

She came to them in three different stances. Not three separate visions. When they first saw her she was sitting and crying. She was wearing a beautiful crown with a crucifix around her neck. Attached to the crucifix were the nails that fastened her Son, Jesus to the Cross, and the hammer which nailed Him and eventually pulled the nails out.

The children asked here why she was crying. She answered: "If my people do not obey, I shall be compelled to loose my Son's arm. It is so heavy that I can no longer hold it."

She went on to explain: (just read this one from 1846!!) "Many people work on Sunday and have no regard for my Son. Six days we are to work and rest on the seventh."

She further said: "Many people swear and use my Son's name in vain. These are the two things that make my Son's arm too heavy as I try to restrain His arm from falling on the world in punishment: people ignoring Him on Sunday, by working and His Holy Name being used in vain."

Melanie and Maximin witnessed the second stance of the beautiful Lady; she stood up and walked up the mountain. Then the third stance, she disappeared slowly from their sight.

Isn't it amazing to us that 173 years ago, Our Lady was warning us of work on Sundays, ignoring the worship God is so rightfully due. Isn't is amazing that she spoke of using Jesus' name in vain, when we hear that constantly. She was telling us of how much worse things would become if we didn't watch what we do and say. In other words, she asked us to pray and amend these two sins to gain the favor of God. Are we too far gone now? Do we make the claim that that the way it is in the 21c? The last claim isn't worth an argument. More to come on Our Lady of LaSalette as the Missionaries prepare to be among us.

#### Welcome Archbishop Blair

On Sunday, August 18, 2019, *Archbishop Lenard P. Blair* will offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass here at St. Aloysius Church at 10:30 a.m. The Archbishop was born in Detroit, Michigan on April 12, 1949.

He took up his studies at Sacred Heart Seminary, receiving a B.A. in History. He furthered his studies in Rome earning a licentiate in Theology from the Gregorian Pontifical University and a Doctorate (PHD) in Theology from St. Thomas Aquinas University in Rome.

Ordained a priest on June 26, 1976, he went on to serve the Archdiocese of Detroit a vicar general and chancellor. He was a professor of Theology at Sacred Heart Seminary and later became the personal secretary to Edmund Cardinal Szoka, the Archbishop of Detroit. He served Pope St. John Paul II as prefect of Economic Affairs from 1994-1997, in Vatican City.

Upon returning to the United States, he was appointed pastor of the Church of St. Paul in Grosse Point Farms, Michigan. On July 8, 1999 he was appointed auxiliary bishop of the Archdiocese of Detroit. On October 7, 2003, he was appointed Bishop of Toledo, Ohio serving there until his appointment to Hartford on December 16, 2013.

The Archbishop has served in various capacities with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops including the Committee on Women in Society and the Church; the Committee on Catechism and the subcommittee on the Catholic Catechism. He chaired the Committee on Evangelization; he served on the Divine Worship and the Ad Hoc Committee on Religion Liberty.

Every Bishop has a motto. Archbishop Blair's motto is: "Pasce Oves Meas", Latin for: "Feed My Sheep". St. Aloysius warmly welcomes Archbishop Blair on his visit to the parish. I'm requesting that many of you be in attendance at Mass August 18, 2019 at 10:30 a.m. It is a very special time when the Archbishop is among us. Please pray for Archbishop Blair's upcoming visit with us.
